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

Message from GW3 Chairperson

2024—2025 has been a year defined by evidence, advocacy, and action for the Greater Whitsunday region.

From the launch of our digitally enhanced Project Register to the release of four cornerstone research reports, GW3 has strengthened its position as a data-driven voice for regional growth. Backed by collaboration and clear priorities, we are shaping a future of greater possibilities for our industries, communities, and people.

This past year has been one of both momentum and proof for the Greater Whitsunday region. At GW3, we have always known that our people, industries, and communities are central to Queensland's prosperity — but in this financial year we set out to show it, not just say it.

We did this by leaning into data-driven storytelling. Evidence that gives our advocacy real weight and makes our voice even more difficult to ignore. The four major reports we delivered this year speak to that approach. From digital priorities and earth observation technologies to the true cost of flood-affected roads and diversification pathways for the METS sector, each piece of work has become a cornerstone in our advocacy. They don't just sit on a shelf - they go into Parliament; into ministerial meetings; into boardrooms and ultimately give decision-makers the facts they need to act.

Another significant milestone during this reporting period was the launch of GW3's digitally enhanced Project Register, now showcasing more than \$35 billion in regional projects across Mackay, Isaac, and Whitsunday. This dynamic tool enhances visibility of infrastructure, investment, and innovation opportunities, while supporting strategic planning and stakeholder engagement. It is more than a database — it is a data-driven platform that strengthens our region's focus on infrastructure development and economic diversification and connects us directly with investment proponents.

The release of the Greater Whitsunday METS Sector — A Revenue Diversification Strategy, developed in partnership with the Resources Centre of Excellence, was another landmark achievement. As a key deliverable of the Decarbonisation Accelerated Project, the strategy sets out a clear pathway for one of our most critical industries to embrace new opportunities while continuing to support the mining sector. With more than 700 METS businesses operating locally — the largest density in the southern hemisphere — our region's skills base is unmatched. The strategy identifies diversification pathways into emerging industries including critical minerals, renewables, bioenergy, biomanufacturing, the circular economy, aerospace and postmining land use. It also outlines practical actions — from powering a transferable workforce and forging new partnerships, to exploring market opportunities and advocating for regulatory change. In short, it provides the framework to future-proof our METS sector, safeguard jobs, and expand the region's economic

When you consider that the Greater Whitsunday contributes more than \$79 billion in economic output each year to the Australian economy, our role is significant. Our region has been borne and built from traditional industries including resources, manufacturing, tourism, and agriculture. Our growth has been driven by diversity — and our future will be built on our long-standing commitment to innovation, sustainability, and community.

But data alone doesn't tell the whole story. It's how we share it — and who we share it with — that creates change. Over the past year we've created a higher profile for our region than ever before. Our new website has become a living hub of research, reports, and stories. Our videos — from Greater Connections through to Greater Digital Skills — have reached tens of thousands of people, showing the faces and voices behind the numbers. And through traditional media, national conferences, and targeted campaigns, GW3 has secured a place as one of regional Queensland's most consistent and credible voices.

Our advocacy efforts have been front and centre. In Brisbane and Canberra, we took delegations of mayors, industry leaders, and community champions to ensure the Greater Whitsunday region's priorities were heard at the highest levels of government. Whether it was the call for investment in the Bruce Highway, the case for new industries, or the push for a fairer funding model for local government, our message was united: this region makes an outsized contribution for our state and national economy, and it deserves right-sized reinvestment.

Looking ahead, GW3's work is guided by five strategic and interconnected accelerators: Decarbonisation, Digital, Diversification, Workforce Development, and Infrastructure, Energy & Water. These accelerators cut across all industry sectors, and when maximised, they drive growth, innovation, and resilience our region needs to thrive.

GW3 continues to enjoy a positive and productive relationship with our three primary shareholders: Mackay, Isaac and Whitsunday Regional Councils. I would like to thank Mayor Greg Williamson, Mayor Kelly Vea Vea and Mayor Ry Collins, and their respective teams for their ongoing support of GW3.

This year also saw the departure of director Jannik Olejas. On behalf of the Board, I thank Jannik for his valuable insight, professionalism, and commitment to both the organisation and the region. At the same time, we welcomed new directors Andrew Wheaton, Principal of Whitsunday Anglican School, and Sean Milfull, from Whitehaven Coal. Their appointments strengthen GW3's leadership team and reflect our commitment to driving sustainable and inclusive economic development across the Greater Whitsunday region.

GW3's growing influence is grounded in the power of its people and the stories we tell together. Our strength lies not only in strategy and research, but in the commitment of our Board, our partners, and our team to turn vision into action. I want to acknowledge our CEO, Kylie Porter, and the dedicated GW3 staff, whose passion, professionalism, and belief in this region bring our work to life every day. Together, with the support of our communities, we remain committed to celebrating the success of our traditional sectors while unlocking the full potential of our emerging industries — ensuring that Greater Possibilities are not just imagined but realised.

In November 2024, GW3 joined regional Mayors and CEOs in Canberra to put the Greater Whitsunday's priorities on the national agenda.


Over three days, the delegation held 13 meetings, hosted a regional advocacy dinner, and attended key parliamentary events, including the Annual Statement to Northern Australia.

The message was clear: this region delivers an outsized contribution to the nation's economy, and it is time for a right-sized reinvestment.

Greater Possibilities at Queensland Parliament

In April 2025, GW3 led a delegation to Brisbane, joined by regional mayors, to showcase the economic strength and potential of Greater Whitsunday.

With the theme "Greater Possibilities", the delegationbuilt awareness among state parliamentarians — many new to their roles — about the region's role in powering Queensland's prosperity.

Discussions focused on securing infrastructure certainty, investment in State Development Areas (Mackay and Abbot Point), and policy support for agriculture and aquaculture.



ROADS ADVOCACY: STATE ELECTION 2024

The True Cost of Road Closures

Roads remain the region's biggest barrier to productivity.

Research showed the Greater Whitsunday experiences an average of 71.8 road closures for 140.6 days per year, costing the regional economy \$287M annually.

"Average rainfall in Mackay is up to three times higher than South East Queensland. Closures after cyclones due to poor road infrastructure significantly hampers a community's recovery and our region's ability to remain productive."

FEDERAL ELECTION PRIORITIES, MAY 2025

Calling for Fairer Funding and **Greater Possibilities**

Ahead of the 2025 Federal Election, GW3 launched its Greater Whitsunday Federal Election Priorities, centred on "Greater Possibilities".

"The entire Greater Whitsunday region makes an oversized contribution to the Australian economy, with a total economic output of \$79B annually."

The campaign called for:

- A fairer funding model for local governments (increase from 0.5% to 1% of total taxation revenue).
- Investment in roads and digital infrastructure to boost productivity.
- Support for community-building projects, including the Great Barrier Reef Arena (Olympics 2032 cricket venue), Whitsunday Marine Discovery Centre, Northern Beaches Road Network, and Isaac Royalties Road Package.



Using modern technologies such as multi-element soil testing and geophysics, the project is uncovering untapped potential while opening new opportunities for local workforces, supply chains, and post-mining land use solutions.

Deliverables



Decarbonisation

The Decarbonisation Accelerated project mobilised 235+ businesses and stakeholders to take measurable steps toward decarbonisation and diversification, positioning the METS sector for longterm sustainability.

- 4 Leaders Group meetings with 27 partners.
- 400+ participants across 5 key events, including QME Decarbonisation, Net Zero workshops, and Continuing the Conversations (70+ attendees).
- Launched a **Decarbonisation and Gas Scope** Emissions micro-credential with CQUniversity/ BMA.
- Delivered 2 Benchmarking Surveys (100+ responses each).
- Appointed 9 ESG Service Providers to support business adoption.

Survey insights (2025):

- 71% now rate awareness as high/very high (+11% on 2024).
- 61% expect decarbonisation to change operations
- 52% report customers/suppliers require decarbonisation info (+75%).
- 31% now measure emissions (+15%).

At Continuing the Conversation:

- 95% rated ESG very/critically important (up from
- 88% saw climate technologies as clear opportunities (up from 74%).

Through Decarbonisation Accelerated, GW3 is laying the foundation for a low-carbon future, helping businesses adapt while positioning Greater Whitsunday as a national leader in sustainable innovation.



Diversification

In FY24-25, GW3 drove diversification across METS, bioindustries, and post-mining land use.

- Activated the METS Sector Revenue Diversification Strategy, engaging 90+
- Launched METS & MORE campaign, with 70+ participants at the launch:
 - 90% rated diversification as very/critically important (up from 77%).
 - 69% rated their understanding as well/very well (up from 30%).
- Secured funding via the Regional Futures Collaborative Projects Program, enabling BioVision, a digital tool to accelerate regional biomanufacturing.
- Hosted biomanufacturing delegations, including evokeAg Sideline Tour (QUT) and Japan Bioindustry Association (TIQ) with 35+ participants.
- Progressed post-mining land use through enviroMETS Lighthouse Project and the Reimagine Rehab prospectus, advancing regulatory reform, research, and commenced investment-ready opportunities.

GW3's diversification agenda is unlocking new pathways for investment, jobs, and innovation. From biomanufacturing to post-mining land use, the region is demonstrating its readiness to embrace future industries, broaden its economic base, and lead Queensland in building a more sustainable and resilient economy.



Digital

The Greater Digital Skill program provide 25 SMEs with access to digital skills to solve workforce challenges.

- Supported 25 local SMEs to develop knowledge in Al, automation and digital security. Provided hands-on practical mentoring to integrate digital solutions to improve business operations.
- Mapped digital connectivity across the region and collaborated with local government to develop 15 connectivity infrastructure business cases.
- Secured \$288,000 to support local producers integrate AgTech for decarbonisation and enhance the Greater Whitsunday AgTech Hub.

Through the Connect Greater Whitsunday Program 15 connectivity infrastructure business cases were created to advocate for improved digital connectivity across the region.



Workforce Development

Greater Businesses brought together 74 participants from over 50 businesses through three region-wide events, tackling key workforce challenges and equipping local businesses to adapt and thrive in a changing economy.

- Delivered the Regional Innovation Forum with 250 attendees.
- Supported 20 local businesses to adopt new technology.
- Secured \$3 million in project funding for regional initiatives.
- Released Greater Whitsunday Geospatial Economic Impact Assessment report.
- Delivered four Greater Connections videos in a social media campaign, achieving over 85,000 views
- Successfully delivered the 2024-25 Greater Whitsunday Regional Jobs Committee (RJC) Action Plan.
- Built the Greater Whitsunday Future Finder website and developed engaging content to prepare for its July 2025 launch.
- Delivered two Greater Foundations teacher professional development events, a suite of engaging content and upskilling 38 regional educators.

Through delivery of programs such as the **Greater Whitsunday Regional Jobs Committee** (RJC), **Greater Businesses events**, and **Greater Foundations teacher professional development**, workforce development efforts focused on growing local talent, preparing an emerging sector workforce, and evolving existing skills to meet changing needs. These actions have laid the foundation for a stronger, future-ready regional workforce.



Infrastructure, Energy and Water

Infrastructure, Energy and Water are the backbone of the Greater Whitsunday region's prosperity, and GW3 has continued to champion critical projects and partnerships to secure long-term investment, resilience, and future-ready growth.

Bruce Highway Advocacy

- Backed stakeholder calls for long-term investment in Queensland's key freight and passenger route.
- Advocacy aligned with the Albanese Government's record \$7.2B funding package, bringing total federal investment to \$17B.

Agribusiness Water Efficiency

- Partnered with Sugar Research Australia to trial three water efficiency technologies across canegrowing sites.
- Linked results to GW3's AgTech for Decarbonisation Program and the Federal On-Farm Connectivity Program.

Post-Mining Land Use (Bowen Basin)

Formed a regional working group (IRC, WRC, GW3, RCOE) to shape a shared post-mining vision:

- Opportunity areas tailored to diverse mine sites.
- Use of stored mine water as a regional asset.
- New pathways beyond traditional "return to pastoral" land use.

Infrastructure, Energy and Water is both a standalone accelerator and a common thread across GW3's agenda — underpinning decarbonisation, diversification, digital transformation, and workforce priorities.

Diversification


- Continue the diversification uplift of the Greater Whitsunday METS sector through strategic initiatives and promote investment attraction.
